# **Affiliate Faculty Position- CMHC online**

Clinical Mental Health Counseling, Antioch University New England Status: Affiliate Faculty - .60 FTE

Contract Period is for 10 months beginning September 1, 2017. Contract will be equivalent to 60% full-time.

Antioch University New England invites applications for a .60 FTE Clinical Mental Health Counseling affiliate faculty member to join our progressive team September 2017. This 60% Affiliate Faculty Position will work in close collaboration with the CMHC online faculty team to enhance and refine existing program offerings, organizing program materials for the CACREP self-study in progress, and revise clinical and program policies to meet needs of online students. This position may additionally require teaching at least one master's level clinical mental health counseling course in an online platform. The Clinical Mental Health Counseling Program, offered in both online and campus-based platforms, is part of the Department of Applied Psychology in Keene, NH. This department also offers master's degree programs in Dance Movement Therapy and Counseling (DMT), Marriage and Family Therapy (MFT), and Applied Behavior Analysis. The Affiliate Faculty position can be fulfilled remotely (requiring frequent contact with the NH CMHC team but not requiring the faculty member to be on the NH campus).

#### **Position Overview**

The position has responsibilities that may include teaching clinical mental health counseling courses online, program development, policy development, organization and documentation. Other responsibilities may include working with the Academic Technology team on revisions and expansions of courses. The person in this position will also work closely with the CMHC Program Director (PD) and faculty team toward accreditation standards. A strong candidate for this position will encourage and enhance collaboration, be proficient and creative with documentation (multimedia), and exhibit a commitment to task completion. Please note that all faculty members are expected to participate fully in the department and CMHC program faculty team meetings.

The CMHC program is offered in two platforms – one that is predominantly on campus, and one that online with a minimum of two required intensive residency experiences. This affiliate faculty position will predominantly focus work with the CMHC online program.

 Teach a course load to be decided upon and decreased depending on other tasks and responsibilities (at least one course in Spring 2017).

- Develop an orientation for new CMHC faculty and students.
- Organize and Document a Curriculum Package that includes updating and collecting all program Syllabi
- Articulate, record and document the Program Narrative
- Develop and document a Student Portfolio Process
- Articulate and document program policies
- Develop a presentation for the Antioch Grading System
- Articulate and document Antioch's curriculum emphasis on Social Justice
- Attend CMHC program meetings (virtual or in-person)
- Assist program faculty with the collection and documentation of other program materials required for the CACREP self-study

#### **Educational and Experiential Requirements and Qualifications**

An earned doctorate in counselor education and supervision preferred (CACREP-accredited program), eligible for licensure as a mental health counselor, and at least three to five years of professional clinical experience, and graduate teaching experience.

#### **Preferred Qualifications/Areas of Interest**

Preferred qualifications include expertise in one or more of the following areas: online pedagogy for counselors, program and policy development and documentation, experience in a CACREP self study. As Social justice is infused within all aspects of the Antioch programs, a knowledge and commitment to social justice is preferred.
