

Position Announcement Tenure-Track Positions: Assistant Professor of Counseling

The Department of Counseling and Special Populations seeks highly qualified candidates to fill two full-time, tenure-track positions at the rank of Assistant Professor in Counseling. The successful candidates will teach on-campus and online graduate classes in the counseling core in clinical mental health counseling and/or school counseling courses. **Start date could be as soon as January 2018 (preferred) or June 2018.**
