Specific responsibilities include teaching specialized graduate courses in clinical mental health counseling (addiction/substance abuse counseling and other counseling courses), providing clinical supervision and academic advisement for students, participating in departmental and university activities, being affiliated with professional counseling organizations, and engaging in research and scholarly activities.
