Successful candidates must be qualified to teach core counseling courses as well as courses in the specialty area of clinical mental health counseling. Experience as a college counselor (or equivalent) is preferred but not required.

Responsibilities:

Primary responsibilities for the new colleague include teaching seven graduate counseling courses per year; advising students; collaboration with students, colleagues and community partners; and implementation of an impactful research agenda.
