Faculty Position – Counseling and Human Services Educator
Counseling and Human Services Undergraduate Program

This Assistant Professor position is full-time, 9-month, tenure track, starting in August, 2018. The Counseling and Human Services (CHS) Department is home to a CSHSE accredited undergraduate program in Counseling and Human Services with an optional concentration in rehabilitation services, and three CACREP accredited master's programs (Clinical Mental Health, Rehabilitation Counseling, and School Counseling). The department aims to recruit applicants from diverse backgrounds with a commitment to excellence in teaching, scholarship, service, and dedication to students' professional development.

This position is for a counseling and/or human service educator. Besides teaching in the CSHSE accredited undergraduate program, the successful candidate will also have the ability to teach core courses at the graduate level, including supervision of counselors in training. Responsibilities include a 21-credit workload, research and publication, and student advisement/mentoring. Individuals who possess experience teaching core undergraduate counseling/human services courses are particularly encouraged to apply.

Requirements include an earned doctorate in Counselor Education or a closely-related field (Note: ABD with completion by August, 2018 will be considered). Preferred: graduate of a CACREP-accredited program, and possession of, or eligibility for, additional credentials (e.g., NCC, CRC, LPC, HS-BCP). Ideal applicants will also have experience and a proven track record of work with counseling and human services endeavors. Interest in teaching Research Methods as well as a background in program assessment and evaluation are desirable. Excellence in teaching, pursuit of an active research agenda, and professional, campus, and community service are necessary for promotion and tenure. Opportunities for future department leadership positions, such as Program Director, are potentially available.
