**QUALIFICATIONS**

**Required:**

- Ph.D. or equivalent in Counselor Education from a CACREP-accredited program, or Counseling Psychology or Clinical Psychology from an APA-accredited program. ABD will also be considered; however, contract renewal will be contingent on completing degree within one-year of date of hire.
- Teaching, research, and/or clinical experience in one of the following areas: integrated care or clinical health counseling/psychology, family and couples counseling, and/or multicultural counseling
- Demonstrated promise as an instructor of record as evidenced by teaching evaluations
- Demonstrated promise as a scholar
- Experience providing clinical supervision

**Preferred:**

- Ph.D. or equivalent in Counselor Education from a CACREP-accredited doctoral program, or employed as full-time faculty member in a CACREP-accredited counselor education program for at least one full academic year before July 1, 2013
- Experience teaching integrated care or clinical health counseling/psychology, family and couples counseling, or multicultural counseling at either the undergraduate or graduate level
- Licensed or license eligible as either a Professional Counselor or Psychologist in the State of Wisconsin within 2 years of hire
- Experience in program development
- Experience in academic advising
- Experience working effectively with students and staff from culturally diverse backgrounds
