Job Responsibilities:

The School of Counseling at University of the Cumberland seeks a counselor educator to join our faculty as an assistant, associate or full professor. Primary responsibilities will include teaching three counseling courses each semester (fall, spring and summer) in the areas of clinical mental health, addiction treatment and counselor education and supervision. *While this position serves both masters and doctoral students, their primary responsibility will be to doctoral students and bringing research experience and expertise to the department.* Faculty members are expected to participate in shared faculty governance, curriculum development, recruitment, student advisement, dissertation committees, scholarly research, and professional service activities. The School of Counseling hires and respects a diverse faculty.

At the same time, we are also looking for synchronous online adjunct instructors for the spring semester and beyond. The School of Counseling has two Master's degrees in Clinical Mental Health Counseling and Addiction Counseling. We also have a doctoral program in Counselor Education and Supervision. Our programs are CACREP accredited and are all taught in an online synchronous format, meaning that each class meets online, once a week in the evening for eight weeks, utilizing the Blackboard Collaborate integrated software. We require an earned doctorate and professional counseling identity. Most of our core faculty are hired from our quality adjunct professors.

Job Qualifications:

1. Earned doctorate (by time of appointment) in Counselor Education. Each faculty member must serve as CACREP core faculty.
2. Licensed as a Professional Counselor, or eligible
3. Record of professional and scholarly productivity
4. Effective oral and written communication skills
5. Experience using a variety of instructional technology and delivery methods

1. Knowledgeable of CACREP-accredited counseling programs

2. Experience teaching graduate level CACREP core areas as well as specialized courses in clinical mental health and career development
3. Successful teaching experience at the graduate level

6. Work experience in clinical mental health and/or addiction treatment
7. Experience in clinical supervision
